#### A New School Building

My name is Sarah and I'm a student at Langleys School. Last week was a great week, as we were able to move into our new school building! Another thing you'll notice is that the school roof has a tree on top of it! It was put there by the builders once they'd finished the roof, because they said it was the custom in Austria, the country where the roof was made.

The electricity for lights and computers comes from a wind turbine on a hill behind the school. We went with our teacher to look at it yesterday, and it goes round really fast. It's so big, it can be seen for miles! We took some pictures which we're planning to put on the website.

Even though we're already using the school building, there are still some parts to be added to it – for example, at the moment we're putting on a play for parents to come and see, but we still have to walk back to our old school hall to do it. The new one will be ready by next year, though. We're so pleased with our new school, and our teachers say we'll all learn much faster now we're in it!
